Thammasat University has, in different ways, contributed to keeping Bangkok safe. Already during the Second World War, Thammasat served as the headquarters of the Free Thai Underground.

In the seventies, it became the centre of pro-democracy protest movements, and in 2019 Thammasat worked in partnership with the UN Women and Thai Health to announce its Zero-Tolerance against Sexual Harassment Policy.

Places like these are pioneers and trailblazers in the fight towards safer cities and equality. Thammasat University will be the first stop on the bicycle event 'A Safe Journey for Her', taking place on 26 November 2022, signifying the importance of a safe environment for women and girls to thrive in.

09:30 hr

The cycling group arrives at stop 2:

Thailand was ranked 130th (behind all ASEAN countries, except Brunei) for filling the gender gaps in political empowerment (World Economic Forum, 2022)

Our society will fair better if we end discrimination against women and girls. By amplifying their voices and supporting women to be in leadership positions, we contribute to ending violence against women and girls.

During the bicycle event 'A Safe Journey for Her' on 26 november 2022, we will make a stop at the Banglampoo community, where Pa Nid, Omrasri Silpi, the first female leader, reminds us of the power of community and the rich history of Banglampoo. She continuously encourages children and females to break all gender barriers and work for a better life.

10.15 hr

The cycling group arrives at stop 3:

The Thepthidaram Temple is decorated with images of 52 bhikkhunīs (female monks) on the left side of the ordination hall. Thepthidaram was the first temple that was dedicated to women. The design and architecture were inspired by the female context in Bangkok history and Buddhism. This helps to remind us of an example of women's contribution to social, cultural, and religious life and the importance of the respect for the equal standing between women and men.

The Thepthidaram Temple is the third and final stop on the bicycle event 'A Safe Journey for Her', taking place on 26 November 2022, signifying the importance of equal rights for women and girls.
