Expert Consultation on Women and Technology Data

The Expert Consultation on Women and Technology Data hosted by the Centre brought together 26 leading gender and data experts from UN Women, the UN Department of Economic and Social Affairs, the International Labour Organization, the Food and Agriculture Organization, Pulse Lab Jakarta, academia, civil society organizations and national statistics offices to discuss gender differences in human interaction with technology and conceptualize ways to measure such differences.

First International Women's Day Celebration

March 2023

The Centre hosted its first International Women's Day celebration in Seoul. More than 100 diplomats and international development experts from almost 60 countries, including some 30 ambassadors and heads of international organizations based in ROK, gathered to reflect on the importance of gender equality and to reaffirm their support to UN Women's mission.










