# Feminist action for climate justice: An enabler to building the resilience of communities

## **Background**

A changing climate affects everyone, however, its impacts are not gender-neutral. Women and girls bear the disproportionate impacts of the climate crisis, which amplifies existing gender inequalities and poses unique threats to their livelihoods, health, and well-being. Recognizing the specific needs, but also the respective capacities and contributions of women as the agents of positive change will be crucial for building the resilience of communities. To ensure that the bold ambitions of the 1995 Beijing Platform for Action on women's rights are finally implemented and that the Sustainable Development Goals are achieved, the **Generation Equality Forum (GEF)** was launched in 2021 with a 5-year action agenda to accelerate investment and catalyze collective action on gender equality. Convened by UN Women, the GEF is an innovative global multi-stakeholder partnerships forum mobilizing governments, civil society, youth-led organizations, international organizations, philanthropy and the private sector for gender equality. Feminist Action for Climate Justice (FACJ) is one of the six Action Coalitions (AC) of the GEF with 234 programmatic, financial, advocacy and policy commitments from the governments, private sectors, civil society organizations and philanthropies.

Globally speaking, the Asia-Pacific region is the most populous, the most disaster-prone region and accounts for the highest share of greenhouse emissions. But with the vast renewable energy potential, diverse ecosystems and emerging markets, the region has enormous prospects for a gender-just equitable transition to a low-carbon economy. Unlocking this potential requires leveraging regional cooperation and partnerships. The 8th Asia Pacific Adaptation Network (APAN) Forum offers an unparalleled opportunity for regional actors to share information, knowledge and best practices in adaptation and resilience building.

This pre-APAN panel discussion jointly organized by the UN Women Regional Office for Asia and the Pacific and United Nations Environment Programme (UNEP) will constitute sharing practical solutions and exploring partnership opportunities for advancing feminist action for climate justice in the Asia-Pacific region. It will be built around the forum's thematic area of focus "resilience of





**communities**" and discusses **gender-responsive policy and programming** as an enabler to transformative adaptation that leaves no one behind.

The session will provide a platform to learn, share and catalyze collective commitments for the Feminist Action for Climate Justice (FACJ) Action Coalition of the Generation Equality Forum (GEF). GEF is a multi-stakeholder initiative to **catalyze partners**, **increase investments and results** in gender equality, **accelerate progress** towards achieving the objectives of the Beijing Platform for Action and the SDGs, as well as sustain and expand a **movement of support for gender equality** with civil society and youth leadership and activism at its heart.

# **Target Participants**

35-40 adaptation practitioners and policymakers attending the 8th APAN Forum and other adaptation events under the wider umbrella of KGAW 2023 are expected to join this pre-forum event in person. Virtual participation via Zoom will be enabled for wider participation.
