Aligned with the global theme for International Women's Day 2025, "For ALL women and girls: Rights. Equality. A key focus of this event is the promotion of gender-responsive practices, in particular gender-responsive procurement (GRP) that ensure equitable market opportunities will be a default condition for all. By encouraging companies to adopt GRP practices, the SET and SEC aim to create a more inclusive supply chain that supports women-owned businesses and ensures fair participation in economic activities. This approach not only empowers women entrepreneurs but also contributes to a more resilient and diversified economy.

Ring the Bell 2025 Theme - For ALL Women and Girls: Rights. Equality. Empowerment

Although significant progress has been made in advancing women's rights since the adoption of the Beijing Platform for Action in 1995, the world now faces overlapping crises and a concerning rollback of rights. This International Women's Day, UN Women invites everyone to push forward in the fight for women's rights, as the world cannot afford to lose ground.

The year 2025 represents a crucial milestone in the global journey toward gender equality and women's empowerment, commemorating 30 years since the <u>Beijing Declaration and Platform for Action</u>. With only five years remaining to achieve the Sustainable Development Goals, the theme for this year emphasizes the urgency of ensuring equal rights, opportunities, and power for all, and envisioning a feminist future that leaves no one behind. At the heart of this vision is the empowerment of the next generation—particularly young women and adolescent girls—who are essential drivers of sustainable and transformative change.

Under the banner of UN Women's global campaign to mark the 30th anniversary of the Beijing Declaration and Platform for Action, "For ALL Women and Girls", this year's International Women's Day is a rallying cry to take action in three key areas:

- 1. **Advance women's and girls' rights:** Fight relentlessly for women's and girls' full range of human rights, challenging all forms of violence, discrimination, and exploitation.
- 2. **Promote gender equality:** Address systemic barriers, dismantle patriarchy, transform entrenched inequities, and elevate the voices of marginalized women and girls, including young people, to ensure inclusivity and empowerment.
- 3. **Foster empowerment:** Redefine power structures by ensuring inclusive access to education, employment, leadership, and decision-making spaces. Prioritize opportunities for young women and girls to lead and innovate.













Objectives

The main objective of the "Ring the Bell for Gender Equality 2025" is to spotlight the transformative role of the private sector in advancing gender equality as a cornerstone for achieving the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs). This initiative particularly emphasizes fostering a supportive and inclusive environment within the capital market ecosystem. UN Women, in collaboration with the Stock Exchange of Thailand (SET) and the Securities and Exchange Commission (SEC), aims to enhance transparency, accountability, and equity by promoting gender-responsive procurement (GRP) and business practices that lead equitable market opportunities.

The workshop's objectives are as follows:

- To highlight and commend the commitments made by leading Thai companies in 2024 and set actionable pathways for 2025 and beyond, focusing on business practices and investments that promote gender equity both within organizations and across supply chains, enhancing the role of women as drivers of economic and social progress.
- To facilitate dialogue and collaboration among key stakeholders by sharing successful strategies, innovative solutions, and best practices in advancing the Women's Empowerment Principles (WEPs), particularly in the areas of gender equality, diversity, and inclusivity in leadership and business practices.
- To consolidate insights and inspire a shift toward inclusive and innovative economic models by engaging ecosystem supporters and thought leaders. These efforts aim to redefine traditional approaches and strengthen the roles of businesses and supporting actors in fostering a marketplace that values equity, innovation, and sustainability.
